





Maggie Mateer McKee's mother's burial place? (Anna Mateer?) With a high resolution scan of the photo, the following information can be made out on the left: Eliza McKee, died March 23rd, 1894[?], aged 72 years; Samuel McKee, Ballymurphy[?], died January 5th[?], 1894[?], aged 72 years. The leftmost partial inscription reads: March 1907, aged 48 years.

The captions are reversed, so that from left, standing in top row, are Robert, Madge, Jim, and Sadie. The mother is unidentified; next to her are Samuel and John; father unidentified, and Jean. Doreen, and Fred are in the bottom row, standing. The mother's name is Mary McKee Lawther, daughter of Maggie Mateer & James McKee. The Lawther father's first name is probably James.



This is the Loughaghery Presyterian Church near Annahilt, Ballycrune, Co. Down Ireland. Its graveyard is the burial place of several Mateer families.
